What is EDP?

The Middle School Extended Day Program (EDP) is a supervisory program designed for all Middle School students remaining on campus after 4:00 PM, who are not involved in a school-sponsored practice, rehearsal, or meeting. This includes athletes who are not picked up immediately after practice, intramural participants who have a late ride home, students who are waiting for an older sibling to finish a school-sponsored activity, and students who are not picked up immediately after applied lessons. There are two EDP programs offered in order to meet the needs of different grade levels.

Why are two levels of EDP offered?

The nature of the middle school child requires that we have two programs in place for our after-school care. Sixth graders are still very young and have limited opportunities to participate in after-school activities. For this reason, the EDP 6 Program provides more structure and activities after school for students during their sixth grade year.

On the other hand, seventh and eighth grade students are older and have numerous opportunities to be involved in extracurricular activities in the afternoon. The EDP 7 & 8 Program provides supervision in the afternoon for these students while giving them the opportunity to attend on-campus, extracurricular events.

■ **EDP 6** is designed specifically for sixth grade students remaining on campus after 4:00 PM. EDP 6 will provide a supervised location in the Lower School from 4:00 until 6:00 PM each school day, with the exception of some early dismissal days. The program is a drop-in service which provides a snack, quiet study time, and some recreation time for the students enrolled. All **sixth grade students** on campus after 4:00 PM who are not engaged in a Lovett-sponsored activity must enroll in this program. Parents will be billed each time their child utilizes the program.

■ **EDP 7 & 8** is designed specifically for seventh and eighth grade students remaining on campus after 4:00 PM. Participants in EDP 7 & 8 must report to the Library Commons area each day at 4:00 PM. The Library Commons, along with the Post Plaza, will be supervised by a faculty member from 4:00 until 6:00 PM each school day, with the exception of some early dismissal days. The program will allow participants the flexibility to attend school events occurring on campus during that time. All **seventh and eighth grade students** on campus after 4:00 PM who are not engaged in a Lovett-sponsored activity must enroll in this program. Parents will be billed a fee each semester.

What will happen in EDP?

EDP 6

Students are to report to the designated area in the Lower School by 4:00 PM to study, complete homework, finish computer projects, or read during a quiet study hall. After 5:00 PM, students will be allowed to play board games, do arts and crafts projects, play outside, watch films, or participate in other activities and games. Snacks are provided daily. Students must be picked up from the Lower School by 6:00 PM.

EDP 7 & 8

Students are to sign in by 4:00 PM each day in the commons area just outside of the Vasser Woolley Memorial Library. They must remain in the commons area or in the Post Plaza, but are free to use the library and computer labs while the facilities are open. If there is an extracurricular activity they wish to attend, they may do so with permission from the faculty member on duty. There is no snack provided. Students must be picked up from the Post Plaza by 6:00 PM.

Behavioral Expectations

The behavioral expectations for students in EDP are the same as during normal school hours. The program follows the behavior and discipline policies as outlined in the Lovett Parent/Student Handbook. Students in EDP 7 & 8 must strictly adhere to all EDP policies regarding staying in the designated campus locations.

Fees

Registration Fee

There is a \$45.00 application fee for either program. This enrolls the student in the program for the entire year. Upon registering, parents will complete an emergency contact form that will remain on file throughout the year.

EDP 6

A flat rate of \$12.00 will be charged for each day that a registered student needs to utilize EDP 6, regardless of whether the student is in the program for 15 minutes or for two hours.

EDP 7 & 8

A \$100 semester fee will be charged for 7th and 8th grade students enrolled in the EDP 7 & 8 Program. This fee covers every day that a student may need to stay late during the entire semester.
